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Reference the Department of Energy/National Nuclear Security Administration (DOE/NNSA), Office of Business Services (OBS) Field Acquisition Department (FAD) July 9, 2007 Sources Sought Announcement that was seeking Capability Statements from industry for an anticipated requirement to provide environmental characterization and remediation services for designated corrective action sites at various locations where underground nuclear testing or related support activities occurred under the cognizance of the DOE/NNSA Nevada Site Office (NSO). The purpose of this specific announcement is to inform interested firms that the DOE/NNSA acquisition team has scheduled an Industry Day Conference for this anticipated requirement on September 18, 2007 from 1:00PM to 5:00PM in Las Vegas, NV. The Industry Day will be held in the Auditorium at the Atomic Testing Museum located at 755 East Flamingo Road, Las Vegas, NV 89119. As a result of space limitations, attendance will be restricted to 2 representatives from each company until the maximum seating capacity of 130 is reached. To reserve space at the Industry Day Conference, please send an email request to Clay Burgess at CBurgess@doeal.gov by 4:00 PM (Mountain Time) September 10, 2007. Your request must specifically identify your company name as well as the specific name(s) of the individuals who will be attending. A confirmation message will be provided by a DOE/NNSA OBS representative. Reservations for the Industry Day Conference will be on a "first come" basis. Please note, attendance/participation at the Industry Day Conference is encouraged but is not a prerequisite for participation in any solicitation that may eventual result from the conference. DOE/NNSA will not be responsible for any costs incurred for attending the Industry Day Conference. The purpose of the Industry Day Conference is to provide preliminary information of DOE/NNSA's anticipated technical requirements, business/contract considerations, acquisition approach being considered by DOE/NNSA, the acquisition road ahead, obtain industry input/feedback, and finally, provide an opportunity for interested firms to network with each other. The link to this specific acquisition on the web site is expected to be available approximately August 28, 2007. As a reminder, the applicable North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS) Code for this requirement is 562910, Environmental Remediation Services, which has a small business size standard of 500 employees. After preliminary review of the Capability Statements received from industry, we expect that the acquisition will be a set-aside; however, the exact nature of the set-aside has not yet been determined. Firms interested in attending the Industry Day Conference should take this set-aside expectation into consideration when deciding whether to participate. This announcement is not a request for proposal and in no way commits the Government to award a contract. No solicitation exists at this time.
